

Spire View

Spire View is a new development providing a therapeutic environment for young people with Autistic Spectrum Disorders, Asperger's Syndrome and complex needs that may challenge the service, individuals that require intense levels of support in a therapeutic, homely environment.

The accommodation includes 6 large en-suite bedrooms, two sitting rooms, a dining area and access to a patio and garden area and the facility to develop a kitchen/sensory garden as part of the therapeutic programme. The service users will also enjoy access to the in-house Inspire Centre incorporating activity programmes, relaxation and Hydrotherapy.

An important part of the support provided is to enable service users to participate in community projects and a vehicle is provided to facilitate this, with particular emphasis on attending our rural project in Northumberland where service users will have access to an array of structured outdoor activities.

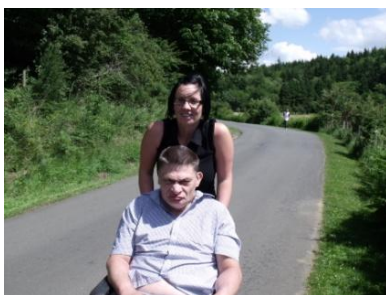
The staff team at Spire View is vital to providing the foundation for a quality service; therefore Careline Lifestyles have a strong commitment to individual development and professional growth of each team member.

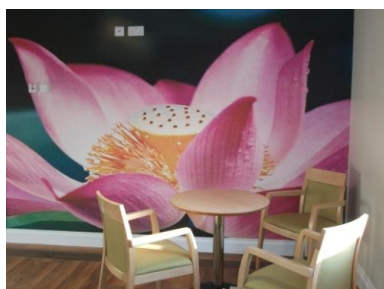


Specialist Support
